### Epilepsy is a hidden disorder.

Despite how common it is, fear and stigma still exist. It's easy to feel isolated and alone. But at Camp EAGR, everyone knows what it's like to have epilepsy. Campers don't have to be embarrassed by taking medications, having seizures, or having epilepsy. Everyone at camp understands! Kids with epilepsy can be just KIDS! And siblings connect with other siblings who know what it's like to have epilepsy in the family.

### Who is camp for?

Camp EAGR is for boys and girls with epilepsy, aged 8-17, and siblings are welcome. Seizure control is not required to attend camp - all campers will find something valuable in camp regardless if they have seizures every day or every 5 years. All children need to be ambulatory (camp is not wheelchair accessible) and must be able to take care of their own personal care needs.

### Fun in a safe environment.

Camp EAGR is all about providing summer camp fun in a safe manner. Medical personnel are on-site 24-hours a day. This includes a combination of RNs, NPs, and at least one neurologist who specializes in pediatric epilepsy. Our volunteer counselors are often former campers, and are background checked and trained on an annual basis.
