
- Let's Talk Early Intervention @ Seamen's Society
  - August 10th
  - Where would the data walk live in the overall agenda of the event?
- Data Walk
  - <u>Host data walk at a large enough space for participants to</u> <u>spread out and speak without overlapping</u>
  - $\circ$  Make sure data is easily visible ( large enough to see clearly )
    - Not overwhelming content-wise
    - Bigger print
    - Visually striking to catch attention
  - Prioritize data points what is most relevant to the overall point of the data walk
  - Have someone who is not so embedded in EI work to write out the points to make the information more easily accessible to the masses
  - Data comparisons between SI and NYC overall
  - Qualitative data one poster with quotes from parents collected from previous EI events
    - "Has this also been your experience?"

- Emphasize local voice ( that the quotes C COMMUNITY m community members)
   E ENVIRONMENT
- Strong prompts to guide discussion
- Diverse groups when walking through the data walk
- <u>Touch base with parent focus group about data to pull,</u> <u>framing language for questions, etc</u>
- Have someone posted at each data point to help facilitate conversation if needed.
  - Hand out post-its
  - Give general overview not to much information
- Translate content
- Timetable for the content to showcase if changes have occurred over time
  - Check with CCC about more recent data (end of 2021 / start of 2022)
    - CCC will follow up with BEI for more recent information
- Have short introduction before the data walk
- Have a closing discussion after the data walk to speak on what was learned
- Have a separate room where video testimonies can be filmed
- Have a few providers (no more than 3)who work directly with families present, who can speak at the end discussion
- No more than 5 overall data posters
  - Waterfall effect and referrals by ZIP codes
- Audience will be from all of North Shore
  - Data presented will focus on 10303, 10302, 10310
  - Any families from other ZIP codes can speak on their experiences within their communities in comparison to the data given
- Take data given and show to test group to see what presentation of information is most easily digestible / understood
  - Pie chart, bar graph, column, etc
  - Some data points are not conducive to certain presentations - keep in mind when determining how best to present data
