• Power wheelchairs are not eligible secondary to the electrical components of these wheelchairs.

As the wheelchair clinic is **NOT** for power wheelchairs, here are some tips CP Unlimited wanted to share to keep your chair clean:

When cleaning power wheelchairs:

- The surface should be cleaned with a wipe such as an aseptic cloth.
- Do not use flowing water to rinse such as a hose or a bucket of water. It is important to not use
 any running water on the base of the power wheelchair as there are components that are
 sensitive to water.
- The joystick on a power wheelchair can be cleaned with a damp cloth and a diluted sanitizer. Remember if your wheelchair is not properly dried, it can cause damage.
- For ingrained dirt, try scrubbing lightly with a soft brush.
- If you take your chair outdoors, use a damp cloth to wipe off excess dirt, or wait until the dirt dries off and use a soft brush to brush down the wheels and the base. Use tweezers to get hair and fluff out of your wheels.
- Regular cleaning can help prolong your chair's life and keep well-functioning.

Cleaning Your Power Wheelchair

Before cleaning your power wheelchair with this guide, <u>it's important to read the</u>

<u>manufacturer's maintenance instructions for vour power wheelchair for specific cleaning</u>

<u>rules</u> and any methods or materials to avoid. The following instructions are generally applicable to every chair and will help achieve the best results.

You'll Need:

- Disinfectant Spray
- Mild Dish Soap and Detergent
- Compressed Air Can Duster
- Microfiber Towel
- Cleaning Brush or small brush such as toothbrush

Instructions for Cleaning Your Power Wheelchair:

- 1. Unplug the power chair from its power source
- 2. Use compressed air to blow out any dust, dirt or debris in the hard to get to areas near the battery region and any other crevices in the wheelchair base.
- 3. Spray disinfectant to the chair base and wipe off the chair base with a microfiber towel to avoid scratching the paint. Be cautious not to spray the electrical areas. Then wipe clean with a microfiber towel.
- 4. Use a toothbrush to scrub the joystick area, as well as any extra dirty spots. Be cautious to not use too much cleaner near the electrical areas.
- 5. Vacuum the seat cushion thoroughly. For vinyl, hand wash it with a mild dish detergent and warm water. Use a rag or cleaning brush to rub the solution into the seat. Be sure to let all seat cushion types air dry before usage.
- 6. Wheels: Use a damp cloth to wipe off excess dirt, or wait until the dirt dries off and use a soft brush to brush down the wheels and the base. Use tweezers to get hair and fluff out of your wheels.
- 7. May use a light spray with the air freshener of your choice on all seating surfaces.
