# **Data Collection/Review**



- Common Agenda Indicators / Data
  - o Family Empowerment
    - Meeting with the SI Parent Coordinators
      - Track parent engagement (PTA)
    - Active/Inactive PTA
      - Do they meet monthly?
      - Are parents participating?
      - What are the PTA's goals? (speak with schools individually)
    - Put together a parent coordinator survey share with Steven
      (SICPW) for review
    - # of parents involved in PTA / NEW parents involved in the PTA
    - Teachers (school staff) involvement in the PTA so the parents feedback can be heard and enacted on by the school
      - Will need to reach out to the schools for information on PTA format/vision (parents and teachers, just parents, etc.)
    - Level of agency of the PTA
      - Does PTA meet with school leadership? Is there an appointed person from the PTA to meet with the school leadership?
      - Do they feel like they [PTA] are making a difference?
    - Parent: VOICE involvement
      - Clarify meaning of "involvement" [bring to the Advisory Board for discussion/feedback]
  - Child Readiness
    - # of ECE programs in the NS\* (\*specific ZIP codes 10301, 10302, 10303, 10304, 10305, 10310)
      - Total: 307 [reach out to Joe for the ppt with all the numbers]
    - # of programs participating in QualityStarsNY
      - Total: 38

- Childcare programs need geography corrections
- Student and Academic Success
  - # of students enrolled in grades 3k-3<sup>rd</sup> in the North Shore
  - % of students receiving additional supports (IEPs & ELLs)
    - Citywide vs Staten Island SY2022
    - Chart is specifically the NS text is SI as a whole
    - Steven (SICPW) pulled data pertaining to IEP. / Learning disabilities – will share with the group
  - % of students chronically absent (CA) from school (pre-k to 3<sup>rd</sup> grade)
    - The lower the grade the higher the % of absences overall the number goes down as the grades go up
    - Think of the qualitive data/reasoning for the high CA % in pre-k / kindergarten
      - Do parents think of pre-k as more of a daycare than academic school?
      - Online/hybrid options being rescinded could have something to do with the rise of CA numbers
      - Why are these children not going to school? Are there outside reasons?
    - Bring numbers to the group and discuss best ways to combat Chronic Absenteeism
  - Tracking students down the line (pre-k to 1st to 2nd, etc.)
    - Specific student data would be needed to make sure that [you] are tracking the same group of students
    - Some students will not have attended pre-k or kindergarten joining 1st grade (children who have moved, etc.)
- All data seen in the referenced presentation was pulled from the North Shore DOE data from SICPW
